The mission of W²T² is to promote the accessibility of information about the international weapons trade through the publication of easily interpretable research, to champion disruptors, and collectively advocate for humane, sustainable, progressive, and anti-imperialist policy. W²T² joins CIP with support from the Carnegie Corporation of New York for a research and education project on the 1122 Program, which contributes to a harmful cycle of police militarization in the United States and state sanctioned violence abroad.
